

- 1. Jurisdiction is proper in the United States District Court for the Southern District of California pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1332.

III. 1 2 FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION Invasion of Privacy Act, Penal Code 630-638 3 Plaintiff realleges all prior paragraphs of this complaint and incorporates the same 16. 4 herein by this reference as if those paragraphs were set forth in full herein. 5 California law prohibits the recording of confidential communications without the 17. 6 consent of all participants where there is an objectively reasonable expectation that the 7 conversation is not being overheard or recorded. 8 18. In 1967, the California Legislature adopted the Invasion of Privacy Act, codified at 9 Penal Code sections 630 through 638. 10 The Act is designed to protect the right of privacy by requiring the consent of all 19. 11 parties before a confidential conversation is recorded. 12 The eavesdropping and recording provision, section 632, provides that any person 20. 13 who intentionally and without consent of all parties to a confidential communication records such 14 conversation is guilty of a crime, punishable by imprisonment in state prison or county jail. (Penal 15 Code, § 632(a).) 16 A private cause of action exists for any person injured by a violation of the Act. 21. 17 (Id., § 637.2.) 18 Section 632 defines confidential communication to include "any communication 19 22. carried on in circumstances as may reasonably indicate that any party to the communication 20 desires it to be confined to the parties thereto." (Id., § 632(c).) 21 Confidentiality requires nothing more than the existence of a reasonable 22 23. expectation by one of the parties that the conversation is not being recorded. 23 The fact that the subject matter of the conversation might later be discussed with a 24 24. 25 third party has no bearing on a finding of confidentiality under the statute. 26 Although the Act contains exemptions for particular individuals or circumstances, 25.

no exemption exists for filmmakers, the media, or journalists.
